



1621 Safety Guidance WITH DRIVEN WHEELS



Using the Cultivator

- Wear your protection equipment including ear defenders and boots.
- If your cultivator has a rear guard covering the tines always make sure it is in the lowered position before digging.
- Always hold the cultivator firmly with both hands while working
- The driving wheels can be engaged without the digging tines to enable to position the machine ready to start. Be sure to keep the stationary tines clear of any path or boarders or they may
- While digging, keep a look out for any stones or other objects in your path. Stop the cultivator and clear them out the way
- The rotating tines can throw out small stones or other hard objects. Do not bend down tot the tines when they are running
- Do not operate the digging tines on concrete or other hard surfaces. Injury or damage may
- If the tines become clogged with long grass or weeds, you must stop the engine. Clear the tines
- If you are working on heavy clay soils, check that is no build-up of clay around the drive mechanism. You must stop the cultivator before you attempt to remove it.
- Reverse gears, if fitted to your cultivator, are only to help you reverse out of tight corners and to position the cultivator. Check behind you before you start reversing. Disengage the tines and wait for them to stop rotating before engaging reverse gear. Be
- extremely careful and keep checking behind you, when reversing.
- Do not try to engage the tines while reversing. 12.
- Take care not to get pushed against a wall or into a corner while reversing. 13.
- 14. While working with the cultivator take care not to lose your footing on the soft uneven ground you have just turned over.
- Stop the engine before leaving the machine unattended. 15.
- 16. Clean the machine at the end of each day before you return it to the hire company.
- 17. If your equipment does not work properly, do not attempt to repair it. Contact the hire company.

The rules and procedures in force where people are at work may require the person responsible for this equipment to carry out a specific risk assessment.

It is important to read this entire leaflet **BEFORE** using the cultivator

- Petrol is highly flammable. Take care not to cause a fire or
- This cultivator is designed for the rapid turning over of soil in the preparation of large gardens and other areas.
- The action of this cultivator can cause injury or damage if the machine is not used in a careful and controlled way.
- Keep your hands and feet well away from the rotating tines.
- If you have not used a cultivator before, practise in the middle of your area to be dug until you are confident you can use the cultivator safely.
- Plan your work and think ahead to make sure you will always be working safely.
- You must have at least the following items of personal protective equipment: Ear muffs or plugs giving protection for levels up to 90 db(A); Safety boots (EN345 or BS1870/4972) to protect feet and ankles; Strong gloves for handling any rubbish in the grass.
- This machine must not be used by minors, or by anyone under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- This cultivator is designed for operation by an able bodied adult. Anyone with either temporary or permanent disability must seek expert advice before using it.
