A tunnel should be used when retuelling. Do not spill any fuel on people or the machine.

The filter cap and the area around it should be cleaned to prevent dirt falling into the fuel

It possible, the machine should be moved away from the work area.

The oil and petrol MUST be mixed in a separate container and NOT in the machines

## Using the Garden Vacuum/Blower

- Protective equipment must be worn including goggles, dust mask, ear defenders and gloves 1.
- Check that there is no waste material in the machine before the engine is started. 2
- Never out hands over the vacuum nozzle or the blower outlet while the machine is in operation 3
- Never point the machine at anyone, not even at a distance. 4.
- If it is necessary to clear a blockage, make an adjustment, or empty the collection bag, the machine 5. must be stopped and the engine and impeller fan allowed to come to a complete stop. For extra safety remove the spark plug lead, this will prevent the engine starting up unexpectedly.
- If any parts or tubes need to be removed to clear the blockage, note/remember how and where they 6. fit
- All the tubes and parts must be replaced before reconnecting the spark plug lead and starting the engine.

# Garden Vacuum/Blower

This safety instruction leaflet gives guidance on hand held machines only; most of these will incorporate a harness. Some machines will only operate as a garden vacuum, some are only garden blowers, but most machines can be used as a vacuum or blower.

### It is important to read all of this leaflet **BEFORE using the Garden Vacuum/Blower**

- Petrol is highly flammable. Take care not to cause a fire or exp This equipment is designed to blow leaves and other debris from gardens, paths and lawns into corners and other suitable areas, ready to be loaded into bags or containers for disposal, and to vacuum up outdoor areas that are lightly covered with garden debris into the collection bag ready for disposal. In use, this equipment can cause injury or damage if the machine is not used carefully and properly;
- (a)
- Do not point at, or touch, anyone with the suction nozzle or blower outlet; (b)
- Removing the vacuum bag on some units may expose the fan/impeller; wait until the engine stops completely;
- (c) Parts of this equipment get very hot; the operator must take care not to burn es or others
- If the machine is designed to be used with a harness, the harness must be used.
- erator must practice using the controls and operating the equipment before using it, if they have d it before. This must be done in a safe place until the operator is confident that they can e it safely. 5.
- The job must be planned to try to forsee any problems that may occur so that they can be safely 6.
- The following is a list of the minimum of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) that must be worn:
- Ear muffs or plugs giving protection for levels up to 90dB (A); Impact resistant goggles: EN166 B or BS2092 grade 1;
- Gloves
- Strong sho Overalls or long sleeves and full trousers;
- A dust mask may also be required providing a minimum of EN149:2001 FFP3 protection;

The shoulder harness should be put on and adjusted properly before carefully attaching the garden vacuum. Attach the equipment using only the correct clips and fastenings.

he harness attachment points are on the suum collection bag it usually means that harness only needs to be worn when wurming.

If the harness attachment points are on the machine, the harness subming adjusted. This applies to both vacuuming and blowing.

Do not use as a vacuum to collect water or nother liquics. Do not vacuum any mining that is we wet. Damp leaves or similar should be blown to a treach pile before vacuuming, this will remove access water. The operator must understand all of the

Prolonged vacuuming of fine dusts lik aswdust will clog up the collection bag and diminish suction. This will reduce th difficiency and overheat the machine.

The equipment should not be used as a general vacuum, or to pick up litter like cans
